**BACKGROUND:**

The African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights (AFCHPR/Court) was established on 9 June 1998 by the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and Peoples' Rights on the Establishment of the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights (Protocol). The Protocol came into force on 25 January 2004 paving the way for the operationalization of the AFCHPR. It is the first continental judicial body charged with ensuring that the provisions of the African Charter on Human and People's Rights, adopted on 27 June 1981, are respected and observed. The Court was launched on 2 July 2006 with the objective of further strengthening the system of human and peoples' rights protection on the continent. The Court complements the protective mandate of the African Commission on Human and Peoples' Rights (Commission). The Court has its seat in Arusha, in the United Republic of Tanzania.

In the framework of the Pan-African Programme, "Strengthening the African Human Rights System programme" (PANAF), the European Union is providing support to the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights in Arusha, Tanzania. The overall objective of the programme is 'to contribute to ensuring a transparent, democratic and accountable environment with respect to human rights and rule of law in Africa'. The programme's specific objective is 'to strengthen the African human rights system in the framework of the African Governance Architecture'. The total budget for the PANAF project is two million

Euros (EUR 2 million) for a period of 3 years (01<sup>st</sup> September 2016 – 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019).

It is against this background that the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights intends to hire interpretation equipment for Training of Legal Counsel which will take place at Mount Meru Hotel from 3<sup>rd</sup> August to 5<sup>th</sup> August 2017

Interested suppliers should submit their proposal by providing a priced offer for the required services.

This should be submitted by either sealed envelope or email not later than 17:00hrs on 26<sup>th</sup> July 2017


