

Memorandum of understanding between African Court and ECOWAS Court of Justice

The African Court and the Ecowas Community Court of Justice renewed their memorandum of understanding (MoU), in June 2023. Areas of cooperation identified include knowledge and information sharing. staff exchanges, ioint training, publications of jurisprudence and research among others within the framework of the constituent instruments of the two Courts.
